Typography

All ValleyCon content should be set in **FF Mark OT**.*

We use Regular as our base weight, and increase or decrease the weight by two steps at a time as needed.

The vast majority of the time, Regular will be joined by **Heavy** which will serve as our primary bold weight.

* FF stands for Font Font, the foundry which makes and sells Mark. OT stands for OpenType, a font file format.

FF Mark OT **Ultra** does not have italics! This limits its usefulness. Luckily, **Heavy** should serve quite well in most cases.



Be careful when using lighter weights; they can be much less legible and are often only suitable for large type sizes.



FF Mark OT comes with additional weights which we do **not** use: Thin, Light, Book, **Bold,** and **Black.**

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Color



ValleyCon uses two slightly different color palettes for screens and print:

Valley Con Key*	#04220f 4, 34, 15	79, 55, 78, 77	*The K in CMYK stands for Key Plate . A Key Plate often has more detail than the other plates, and typically uses black ink. Instead of a pure black, Valley Con uses a very dark green as our 'key' color. (We still print with the same 4 inks everyone else uses, not with spot colors.)

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Logo

The Valley Con logo is a wordmark which replaces the **o** with a **dynamic hexagon**.

At small sizes, the hexagon is left empty to support legibility; at large enough sizes, we fill it with game-related iconography.

When a square or circular logo is called for (e.g. a social media profile image) the dynamic hexagon can pop out and stand on its own.
